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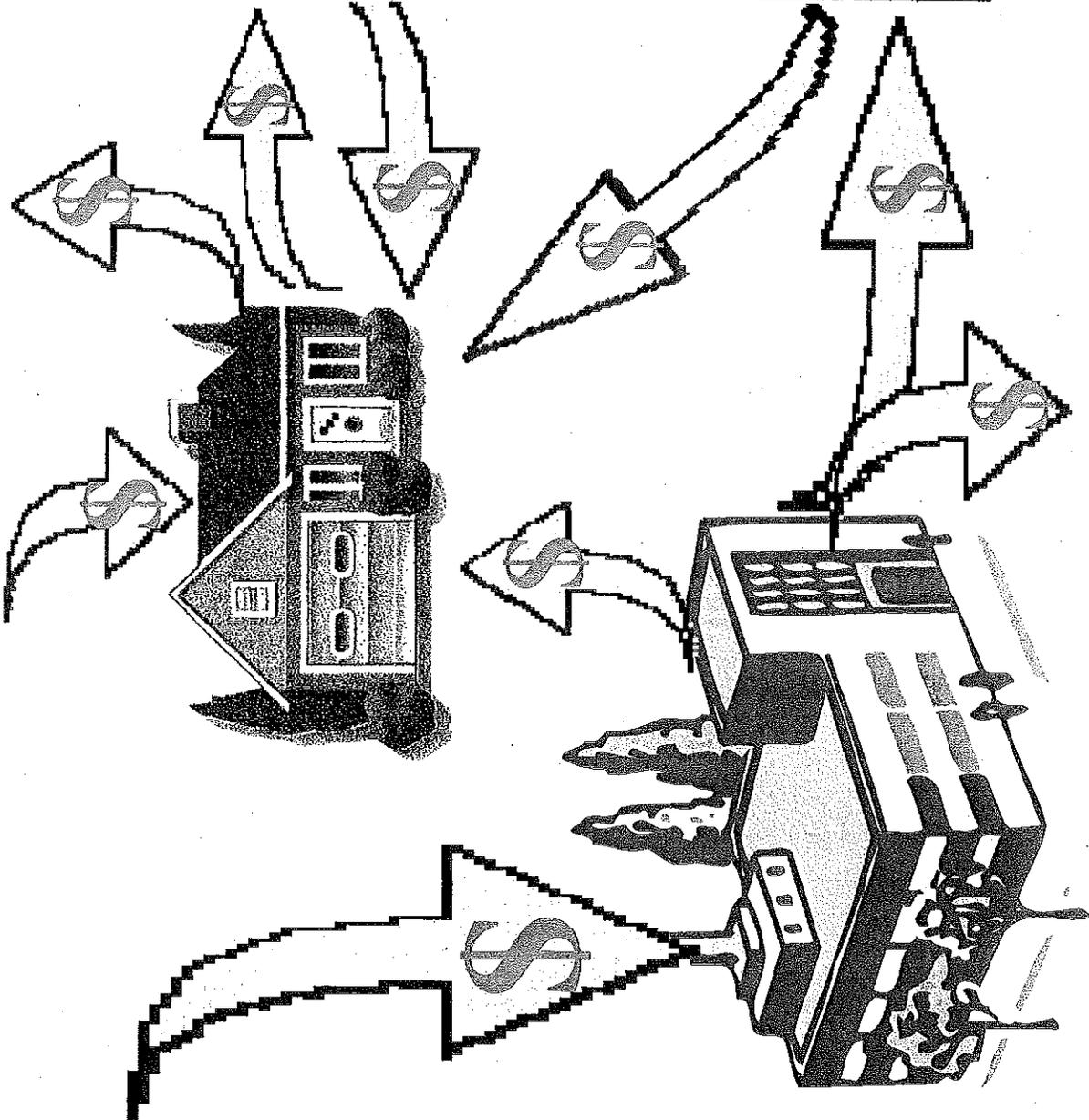
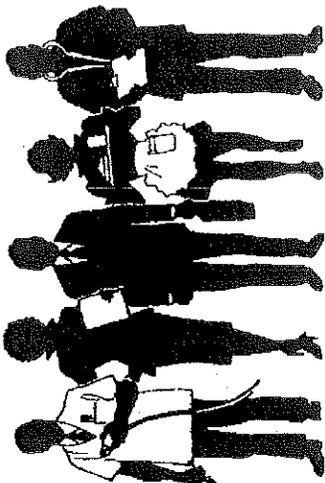

**Setting Priorities for Economic Focus**

- Community-Serving Businesses:
  - Provide goods and services to local population or business
  - Many generate revenue for city
  - Provide jobs
  - Move money around the community

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**Setting Priorities for Economic Focus**

- "Exporting" Businesses:
  - Sell their goods & services to users outside the community, bringing new money into the local economy
  - The more of these, the more successful community-serving businesses
  - The predominant focus of economic development efforts

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**Some Examples**

- Companies manufacturing products to sell to outside domestic and foreign markets
- Companies providing services to outside markets
- Visitors & tourism
- Agriculture
- Region-serving retail

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**Emphasis: Create New Wealth**

- Support the growth of "exporting" businesses
- Support the creation of new "exporting" companies
- Attract "exporting" businesses
- Reduce outside purchases – buy local
- Increase business productivity

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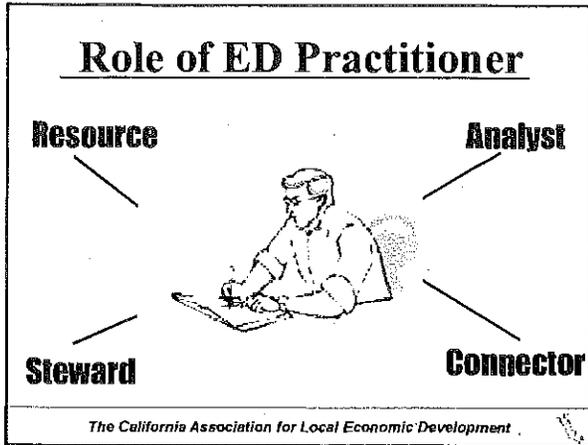

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**Secrets For Success**

- 1) Leadership Drives Economic Development And The Local Business Climate.
- 2) Develop A 'Business' Plan...Strategy, I.E. A 'Road Map'. Know Your Product Before You Go Out And Sell It.. Develop Your Tools...i.E. Your Resources, Your Process, Your Products, Your Prices.
- 3) Pass A Resolution Adopting This Strategy As Policy.
- 4) The Business Of Economic Development. Localities Have To Decide They Are In It For The Long Haul, Three To Five Years Or Longer. It Takes Time To Create A Business.

5) Fund The 'Business'...Minimum Five Year Commitment...You Must Invest To Get.

6) Staff The Business With Professionals...no Business Can Be Run On A Volunteer Basis.

7) Swim Together. Partnerships Good Ones Are Worth The Effort. Above All Communicate And Cooperate.

8) Less Attraction, More Retention, Retention Equals Attraction.

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9) Customer Service Is Essential.

10) Results Are Essential...A Long Term Process With Short Term Results.

11) Consequences/outcomes...measure Success.

12) Public Relations...communicate Your Success To The Community.
