SECTION 1 NAVY TRAINING NOISES-NOVEMBER 12, 2011

On Saturday November 12, 2011, Naval Special Warfare Special Boat Team TWELVE will conduct an Over-The-Beach Field (OTB) Exercise along the ocean beaches of the Silver Strand Training Complex. The training is designed to gain proficiency in clandestine shore insertions. Training can include water insertion and extraction of teams via small inflatable or rigid hulled inflatable boats. Pyrotechnics and blanks are used in simulated attacks from aggressor forces. Blank .50-caliber machine gun fire and flash-bangs will occur in Boat Lanes 11 and 12 (northernmost ocean training areas at Silver Strand Training Complex South) when the participants come ashore and may only involve 5.56/7.62 blank firing thereafter. This exercise will commence at 7:30pm and end at 10pm.

SECTION 2 COASTAL CONSERVANCY VISIT

This week people from the California Coastal Conservancy plus Supervisor Greg Cox, Assembly member Toni Atkins, San Diego Councilmember David Alvarez, and staff members from Assembly member Hueso and Senator Vargas toured potential project sites that might receive financial assistance from the Conservancy. In Imperial Beach they visited the Tijuana Estuary and the Estuary staff emphasized linking the coast, the bay, and the estuary. The Conservancy group also reviewed plans for Bikeway Village, the 10th Street access to the Bikeway, walking trails along the South Bay, and the Eco-Bikeway. Mayor Janney and city staff provided details on Bikeway Village and the 10th Street Access projects.

SECTION 3 PRISON RE-ALIGNMENT

The state has transferred to County government some of its responsibilities to house prison inmates. In a presentation to city managers, San Diego County staff said that they probably have enough prison beds to accommodate the additional inmates, and probation officers hope they can reduce recidivism as they have for County parolees, but continued state funding, though insufficient today, is uncertain in future fiscal years. Therefore the California

State Association of Counties (CSAC) is considering an initiative on the November 2012 ballot to ensure state funding for the prison responsibilities transferred to counties.

SECTION 4 SEACOAST INN

The construction crew began pouring concrete for the first floor of the hotel and the driveway entrance/drop-off from Seacoast Drive.
